Living the Aquatic Life at The Somerset

Daily resort life at The Somerset on Grace Bay can be quite simple. It revolves around the water. It begins with views of Grace Bay Beach, which fronts the resort, a beautiful beach that has been recognized as one of the 10 best beaches in the world by *Condé Nast Traveler* magazine.

No day is complete with stepping into the waters of The Somerset. You can begin with a session in the luxuriously long 105 ft. reverse-current lap pool that stretches nearly into the ocean and pipes in soothing underwater music.

A separate 72 ft. infinity edge pool overlooks the beach and features the gentle, zero-entry shallow area perfect for toddlers.

The shallow turquoise waters are ideal for very young children.

From the sands of Grace Bay, you can embark on any number of aquatic adventures. For the fit and active guest, The Somerset can arrange windsurfing, parasailing, waterskiing, wakeboarding, wake surfing, wave runners and kite boarding.



Guests who are certified divers can enjoy scuba diving trips just off the islands' shore to "The Wall," which lies a few minutes away from The Somerset. This is the great undersea attraction of the Turks & Caicos. There are nearly two dozen dive sites along The Wall, which drops more than 7,000 feet. It is a panorama of Caribbean reef fish, stingrays, spotted eagle rays and sea turtles swimming above an endless carpet of dazzling corals and sponges.

The delights of undersea life can be easily discovered by first-timers on a submarine tour or a glass bottom boat tour. But with so much colorful reef life lying just offshore, one of the joys of staying at The Somerset is the easy access to snorkeling, perfect for both beginners and those experienced in the sport.

Above the waves, you have plenty of choices at The Somerset. You can set sail on an afternoon cruise, go catamaran cruising, take out an ocean kayak, go whale watching or arrange a morning of fishing.

And of course, there's the perfect sand and the gentle surf of Grace Bay itself to enjoy, ideal for strolling and relaxing. It's the idyllic heart of the aquatic experience at The Somerset at Grace Bay.

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The Somerset is located on the pristine beach at scenic Grace Bay, in the Providenciales of Turks & Caicos Islands, a brief hour and twenty minute flight from Miami and an easy three hour, non-stop flight from New York, with service from most other major U.S. and Canadian gateways.
